WASH Facts in Your Country

- In Nigeria access to improved water supply is 64%, access to basic sanitation 36% with 46 million people practicing open defecation
- HHs with access to improved water and sanitation **is 27%**
- 77% of household members drinking water contaminated by E. Coli at the source while 91% of HH's have their drinking water contaminated by E. Coli at the point of consumption
- Only 3.7% of HH members have access to safely managed drinking water source (in line with SDG Indicator)
- 8.5 million people are projected to be in need of humanitarian assistance in the northeast states of Nigeria (HRP 2017)

Results at a Glance (2013- 2017)

Water

- 6.2 million people provided access to improved water supply facilities under FGN/UNICEF WASH Programme
- National Guidelines for water safety planning developed with over 4,000 communities implementing WSP

Sanitation

- Additional 8.3 million people now live in over 12,000 ODF certified communities
- 5.9 million people have access to basic sanitation
- Sanitation marketing and financing is being implemented in 1,200 communities

Hygiene

- National Hygiene promotion strategy and guidelines was developed and in use
- Hygiene promotion campaigns and messages reached over 22 million persons

Institutions

- 1,556 schools were provided access to WASH facilities and reaching over 450,000 pupils
- 440 health facilities were provided access to WASH facilities and reaching over 130,000 patients and caregivers.
- National technical guidelines for WASH in Schools and PHCs developed

Enabling Environment Results

- Development and Launching of the Partnership for Expanded WASH Programme (PEWASH) by the Vice President
- Development and Launching of the National Roadmap for Elimination ODF in Nigeria by 2025 by the Minister of Water resources
- Strengthening of WASH Development Partners Group to coordinate donor investment and programming in the sectors
- Establishment of State RUWASSAs in 5 States with WASH Policies developed and approved in 8 States

- Adoption of WASHIMS as a national information management system and scaling it up from 12 LGAs in 2013 to 200 LGAs in 2017
- Local Investment Plans developed in 88 LGAs
- Development and implementation of harmonized procurement and contract management guidelines including third party contract supervision and verification
- Development of concept and methodology for WASH National Outcome Routine Mapping (WASH-NORM)
